

# Cookies and tracking technologies policy

This document describes how Indivior Plc and our affiliated businesses (collectively “Indivior”) and other third-party entities use cookies and tracking technologies in association with the operation of our main website (www.indivior.com) and all of our websites, and HTML-formatted emails that link to or reference this Cookie Policy (collectively, “Digital Services”).

## 1. COOKIES AND ONLINE TRACKING TECHNOLOGIES

### *Web Browser Cookies*

A web browser cookie is a small text file that is sent by a website to your computer or mobile device where it is stored by your web browser. Web browser cookies may store information such as your IP address or other identifier, your browser type, and information about the content you view and interact with on digital services. By storing such information, web browser cookies can remember your preferences and settings for online services and analyze how you use online services.

### *Tracking Technologies: Web Beacons/Gifs, Pixels, Page Tags, Script*

Emails and mobile apps may contain small transparent image files or lines of code to record how you interact with them. This information is used to help website and app publishers better analyze and improve their services.

## 2. OUR USE OF COOKIES AND TRACKING TECHNOLOGIES

We use some cookies and tracking technologies for purposes which are strictly necessary for your use of our Digital Services. These may include, for example, cookies which remember your preferences and settings; which remember information that you may enter online (so that it does not have to be re-entered every time you move to another page); or to keep you logged in to portals that we may offer where you wish this to happen.

We may also use cookies and tracking technologies for other purposes, such as the generation of aggregate statistics about how people use our Digital Services; for error

management and troubleshooting; and to improve your experience of the Digital Services.

Our Digital Services also use certain third party cookies, which means the third parties who provide these cookies may collect personal data about you when you use our Digital Services.

#### *Performance cookies*

We use Google Analytics to collect statistical information about how our Digital Services are used. Google Analytics services involve the use of cookies that collect information such as your IP address or other identifiers, browser information, and information about the content you view and interact with, to record how you use our Digital Services.

These analytics services help us to know how many users we have, which parts of our sites are most popular, what browsers are used (so we can maximize compatibility), the country or region where our users are located, and the demographics and interests of our users. This enables us to better understand who is using our Digital Services and to improve how we present content on the Digital Services.

#### *Functional cookies*

These cookies enable us to provide enhanced functionality and personalisation. They may be set by us or by third party providers whose services we have added to our pages. If you block these cookies, then some or all of the Digital Services may not function properly.

Certain features on the Digital Services, for example, embedded videos or podcasts, may be offered by or direct you to third parties when you use the feature. Third parties may obtain information about you when you use such features. The third parties' use of your information, including their deployment of cookies and tracking technologies, is subject to the third party's privacy policy—not ours.

### 3. MANAGING COOKIES

#### Cookie settings

##### *Managing Cookies and Local Storage on Your Device*

If you wish, you can choose how web browser cookies are handled by your device via your browser settings. Some devices allow you to control this through your device settings. If you choose not to receive cookies at any time, websites may not function properly and certain services will not be provided. Each browser and device is different, so check the settings menu of the browser or device to learn how to change
